

Fabulous Frog Catcher

Our #MuseumMake today is inspired by one of our smallest objects in the collection. We hope that you have a go and share your #MuseumMakes with us.



Have you seen this little frog in the museum before? Lots of creatures have been hidden for visitors to find in our dioramas. This little frog "Dave" is one of our favourites.

You will need:

- A card tube
- String
- Glue/ tape
- Googly eyes
- Decorating materials- paint, pens or paper
- A sheet of paper
- Scissors

1. Decorate the tube to look like a frog colour the inside too.
2. Fold the tube down one end and glue/tape shut.
3. Make 4 legs and 2 eyes and colour them. Carefully cut them out and stick them to the tube using glue or tape.
4. Draw your own enticing animal for the frog to eat onto a sheet of paper and carefully cut it out.
5. Tape a piece of string in the frog's mouth then tape your animal to the other end of the string.
6. See if you can catch the frog's food in its mouth!
